## NEWS:

**Summer Travel Brings Great Explorations:** This children's museum celebrates its grand re-opening this summer after a \$2.7 million renovation with "all new" exhibits. The museum has relocated to the St. Petersburg warehouse that was Sunken Gardens' "World's Largest Gift Shop." Great Explorations exhibits include a climbing wall and a raceway where visitors build a tabletop racecar, and a sailboat exhibit where visitors learn about direction and air pressure. **Pirates At The Pass:** This new family fun cruise departs from John's Pass Village & Boardwalk aboard a replica pirate ship. **Maze of Illusions at Florida International Museum:** St. Petersburg's Florida International Museum features a new 4,000-square-foot exhibit called *Maze of Illusions and Puzzles*. It offers visitors the fun and science of optical illusions with more than 30 different optical effects hidden in the maze. The challenge is to negotiate the maze and experience the puzzles and illusions, while trying to find the way out. ## **EVENTS:**

**Sailing Camp (May – August):** The Clearwater Community Sailing Center provides safe and affordable sailing opportunities for visitors. Sailing camps are available on weekly or half-day programs. **Camp Create (June – July):** St. Petersburg's Arts Center features the Camp Create weekly Art Camp allowing children to work in a variety of media including photography, jewelry-making, animation, digital imaging, printing, painting and sculpture. Kids learn about art, artists, the creative process and ideas influencing how we see the world. Camps are broken out by age group (5-6, 7-8, 9-12 and 13-15). **Blue Jays Baseball Camp (July 10-12):** This three-day camp features professional instruction in all phases of baseball by Dunedin Blue Jays players and coaches. Dunedin is a minor-league affiliate of Major League Baseball's Toronto Blue Jays. Participants ages 6-16 will be grouped by age and/or skill level. A certified athletic trainer will be on staff to insure a safe experience. Sessions run from 9 a.m. to noon each day and campers will receive a ballpark lunch. Marine Science Summer Camps (May – July): The Clearwater Marine Aquarium's summer camps use a 26-foot Beach Cat and 32-foot Catamaran as secure mobile classrooms from which young scientists can snorkel and explore Clearwater Bay's marine communities. Each camp lasts three hours with an hour of classroom time before heading to the Intracoastal Waterway. While onboard students get to snorkel or wade in the sub-tropical water to discover marine life. Classes are limited to 16 students and geared to specific grade levels. New classes this year include Sea Turtle Hatchling, Sunset Bayou Explorers and Sea Turtle Lab. CMA's summer camps are designed for children between 5 and 15. **Florida Pioneer Summer Program (July 21-25):** Children ages 5-11 will discover what it was like to live in the St. Petersburg/Clearwater area 150 years ago at a summer program held on site in the pinewood forest of Heritage Village. Living history interpreters at Heritage Village will lead children in the crafts and activities of Florida pioneers, including soap making; butter churning; working in a pioneer garden; carding, spinning, dyeing and weaving wool; carving wood; catching and cooking fish, and more. Music and storytelling will round out this unique living history experience.
