St. Petersburg Boat Parade ...Throughout St. Petersburg Dates: 12/06/2003

One of the largest lighted boat parades in the area; St. Petersburg's annual event (which is always held the first Saturday of December) starts at sundown and goes from the Harborage Marina north past the Pier to the Vinoy Basin.
