Showings are held September through May and special presentations are regularly scheduled. The planetarium is a sky theater under a 7.3 meter domed ceiling projection screen.

The museum features a permanent interactive exhibition of the chronology of St. Petersburg's history filled with priceless artifacts, documents and photographs. The Benoist Pavilion houses a replica of the world's first commercial airliner which made the first scheduled commercial flight from St. Petersburg to Tampa on January 1, 1914. The old bridge will be dismantled, but its approaches have been converted into the state's longest fishing piers.
